MADE IN MADISON COUNTY ITINERARY

Start your day at the Madison County Chamber of Commerce Welcome Center (73 Jefferson Street), where you'll find maps and directions to the covered bridges, restrooms, souvenirs, and locally-made products, as well as The Bridges of Madison County movie memorabilia. Check www.madisoncounty.com for seasonal hours. You can also schedule a personal guided tour of the bridges through the Chamber.



Treat yourself to a freshly baked apple fritter (in honor of the first Delicious apple tree being discovered here in Madison County) at **The Bakery**. Open Tues-Sat. Grab a freshly roasted cup of coffee from Pammel Park Coffee Co. at the new **Petite Cafe**.



Visit Rusty Stars Alpacas, a charming 20-acre farm where you can meet alpacas up close. Learn about their remarkable fiber, then shop for handmade products at their farm store. Open to the public on Saturdays from 10-4.



Nearby is **Simple Life Farms** where Eric and Diana Smith raise Lamancha goats and process their milk into delicious cheeses and luxurious soaps, lotions, lip balms and more. They are also open on Saturdays from 10 am to 4 pm.



Shop for curated products, local produce and freshly baked artisan bread at one of Madison County's farm stores. Farmstand by Manastash Mercantile is located in St. Charles and is open on Fridays and Saturdays. On Sundays, Speckled Hen Farms is open in Winterset.

Howell's Greenhouse and Pumpkin Patch is a family farm that covers a little over 800 acres. Since 1985, farmer Fred has been raising flowers specifically for use as dried florals. Howell's also raises goats that you can cuddle or do yoga with. In the fall, Howell's has incredible family activities. Open daily.
