








Quilting Retreat In Madison County, Iowa

	<p>Begin the day at Madison County Chamber of Commerce's Welcome Center, located at 73 Jefferson Street in Winterset's town square, where you will meet your step-on tour guide. The Welcome Center is also where you'll find public restrooms, souvenirs and locally-made products, including bottles of wine from all three of Madison County's wineries.</p>
	<p>Start your two-hour guided group tour (\$10.00/per person) at Winterset's City Park, home of the Cutler-Donahue Covered Bridge and an English Hedge Maze, among many other attractions. Next stop is the Cedar Covered Bridge, which is illustrated on the cover of the book. Lastly, you will ride out to the Roseman Covered Bridge, which figured prominently in the book and movie.</p>
	<p>Return to Winterset's town square where you will tour the brand new Iowa Quilt Museum, located in the old J.C. Penney building. The museum offers changing exhibits—three to four per year—of American quilts both vintage and new. The current exhibit is Three Centuries of Red & White Quilts. Admission is \$6.00/per person.</p>
	<p>Enjoy lunch as a group or on your own in one of our many restaurants, or have a catered lunch brought into your work space. Make special arrangements to have Marianne Fons of Fons & Porter speak to your group!</p>
	<p>Shop at Ben Franklin and Piece Works Quilt Shop for supplies, then get to work in Piece Work's upstairs meeting room which can house approximately 24 guests. You are free to work there until midnight each day, and start the next morning as early as 6:00 am.</p>
	<p>Choose from our many dining options for dinner.</p>
	<p>Madison County has many options for lodging available, including the 39-room Cobblestone Inn, the Covered Bridge Inn, and several charming B&Bs, including a 3-bedroom lake house to rent by the night.</p>

In addition to the attractions listed, we are home to the John Wayne Birthplace & Museum, the Madison County Historical Complex, a historic town square filled with boutique shops and eateries (including Heartland Fiber and Madhaus Gallery, a working artist studio available to rent or to take classes), three wineries, and much, much more.
